Partners in Design Architects is pleased to announce that they are accepting applications for their annual PiDA π (Pi) Scholarship. In recognition of our partnership with the Zion Benton Township High School District 126, we are appreciative of the opportunity to continue to give back to the community in this way.

Partners in Design Architects has a passion for quality architectural design and a commitment to improving the built environment in Lake County and the region. We also believe strongly that we have a responsibility to foster the ambitions of our youth throughout the area.

The amount of the scholarship is a one-time \$1,000.00 scholarship and is open to ZBTHS and New Tech Seniors who are interested in pursuing post-secondary education in the fields of Architecture, Engineering or Art. The scholarship will be made payable to the institution in the student's name following successful completion of their first semester of school.

An Applicant must:

- 1. Be a Zion Benton Township High School or New Tech Senior who:
 - a. Resides in Lake County; and,
 - b. Will graduate from a Zion Benton Township or New Tech High School
- 2. Have a minimum GPA of π (3.14159265) on a 4 point scale.
- 3. Be seeking a two or four year post-secondary degree.



- 4. Demonstrate good academic performance; participate in community and school activities, and exhibit leadership and citizenship qualities.
- 5. Submit a maximum one page essay, typed single space in no larger than 12 point font. The topic of the essay should be about why you want to pursue a degree in Architecture, Engineering or Art and why you feel you should receive the scholarship and how you believe the scholarship will benefit you.
- 6. Complete the PiDA π Scholarship Application and mail together with an original High School Transcript to the address below, postmarked no later than **March 14, 2024**:

- 7. A limited number of students will be selected, based on the information submitted, for a personal interview with members of the PiDA Scholarship Committee.
- 8. A final scholarship recipient will be selected from the interview group based on the evaluation of the written essay and the personal interview.

Please fill out the application completely and accurately. Incomplete applications will not be considered. Students who currently have or have had an immediate family member employed by Partners in Design Architects within the past five years are not eligible for this scholarship. This application is designed to highlight your strengths and accomplishments. The awarding of the PiDA scholarship will be based, in addition to academic performance, on community service and school involvement. Each page is evaluated separately, so it is important not to duplicate items. Please choose the appropriate place to list your personal accomplishments. The PiDA π (Pi) Scholarship Committee will endeavor to evaluate your application as accurately and as fairly as possible. We will then notify the applicants we wish to interview.
